Recent FERC licenses, for instance, typically include not only operating conditions but also wide-ranging resource stewardship requirements in areas such as fish passage, water quality, and recreation. Accordingly, licensees must gear up for the prolonged and extensive consultation, reporting, and adaptive management provisions built into their licenses and/or settlement agreements.
